Alternative Grading

Working with The American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO), the AAMC has identified the following three common policies academic institutions are implementing:

- Maintaining their current letter grade system with no change
- Offering opt-in pass/fail
- Offering mandatory pass/fail

In the AMCAS application, all courses with credit hours and letter grades are calculated into the AMCAS GPA, regardless of whether the credit is counted towards a degree or has been counted towards a school-calculated GPA.

Applicant Scenario

Standard Grading & AMCAS GPA impact

Below is coursework entry for an applicant who received standard letter grades during the second semester of their Senior year. The applicant took four courses, three of those courses were classified as Biology (€). The biology classification will impact their BCPM GPA.

The applicant received official transcript (\pounds) grades of A for all their courses. Their total credit hours earned for this semester was 12. Their AMCAS Grades (\clubsuit) converted to A's for their courses this semester. This would be a common transcript of a school that did not change their grading policies.

The applicant's calculated BCPM hours for their Senior year was 17 (\pounds). As we learned from the coursework entry, 12 of those hours were received in their senior year second semester.

The applicant's GPA for All Other (AO) courses was 3.40 (¥). Three of the 15 awarded credit hours (§) were from the applicant's second semester Art course.

The applicant's grading history shows in their Senior year they received a 4.0 BCPM GPA (\bigcirc)

The applicant's calculated BCPM hours for their Senior year was $8(\pounds)$. The remaining 9 hours from their second semester is now being counted under supplemental hours (\mathbf{z}).

The applicant's GPA for All Other (AO) courses was 3.25 (¥). Three of the 12 (§) awarded credit hours are from the second semester coursework and counted as supplemental hours (\mathbf{z}).

The applicant received an AMCAS GPA of 3.55 (**b**) with 20 credit hours (**8**) earned for their senior year.

Standard grades compared to pass/fail

Credit hours for standard grading scales are calculated in both quality points and the GPA.


- 1. AMCAS Weight x Semester Hours = Quality Points
- 2. Total Quality Points / Total Semester Hours = GPA

In the comparison below we're showing the cumulative undergraduate history for both scenarios, pass/fail credit hours are counted as Supplemental Hours and not included in the GPA and hour totals, resulting in 12 less semester hours which reduced BCPM hours, All Other GPA and hours, and Total GPA and hours.



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

Letters of Evaluation

Add Letter of Evaluation/Recommendation

Many medical schools determine whether or not an applicant has met their letter of evaluation/recommendation requirements by the type of letters they receive in support of an application. For example, a medical school may require a committee letter OR three individual letters in support of your application.

Please review the AMCAS Applicant Guide for more information about Letters of Evaluation.

Please identify the type of letter you wish to enter. If you are uncertain as to the type of letters provided by your school/institution, please ask your pre-health advisor or career center prior to answering this question.

O Committee Letter:

A committee is a letter authored by a pre-health committee or pre-health advisor and intended to represent your institution's evaluation of you. A committee letter may or may not include additional letters written in support of your application. A Committee Letter is sometimes called a composite letter.

C Letter Packet:

A packet or set of letters assembled and distributed by your institution, often by the institution's career center.

O Individual Letter:

An individual letter refers only to a letter authored by, and representing, a single letter writer. If you have already included an individual letter within either a committee letter or letter packet, you do not need to add a separate entry for the individual letter.

Select a meaningful Letter Title, as you may need this title later to identify a letter. For example, if this letter were from the University Of X, with a primary contact of John Doe, and you intend to have this letter sent only to MD/PhD programs, you might create a title of "UX_Doe_MD_PhD ".

¹Test scores, like other measurements, are not perfectly precise. The confidence bands around test scores mark the ranges in which the test taker's true scores probably lie. The diamond shapes and shading show that the test taker's true scores are more likely to be their reported scores (in the second column) than the other scores in the confidence bands.

²The percentile ranks of scores are the percentages of test takers who received the same scores or lower scores. The percentile ranks are updated on May 1 every year to reflect the results from the three most recent previous calendar years.

⁹For the four sections, non-overlapping confidence bands show a test taker's likely strengths and weaknesses. Overlapping confidence bands suggest that there are not meaningful differences in performance between sections.





Application and Acceptance Protocols - Admission Officers

Recommendations to help ensure that all MD and MD-PhD applicants receive timely notification about the outcome of their AMCAS® application. These guidelines are not intended to supersede the policies, timelines, or discretion of individual schools or programs. Applicants are expected to become familiar with the procedures and requirements of each school to which they apply.

The AAMC recommends the following guidelines to ensure that MD and MD-PhD applicants are afforded timely notification of the outcome of their applications and timely access to available first-year positions and that schools and programs are able to reasonably anticipate accepted applicant matriculation in order to avoid unfilled positions in their entering classes. For the purposes of these protocols, *matriculation* means that a student has begun a pre-matriculation program, attended orientation immediately preceding enrollment, or enrolled in classes at a medical school.

These protocols are often referred to as "Traffic Rules" by admissions officers and prehealth advisors. These recommendations are distributed for the information of prospective MD and MD-PhD students, their advisors,





Guidelines for Writing a Letter of Evaluation for a Medical School Applicant

Thank you for agreeing to write a letter of evaluation for a medical school applicant!

The guidelines are intended to enhance the letter-writing process by providing a general framework of best practices and relevant content for letter writers to follow. They are optional and can be applied to both individual and committee letters.

Guidelines

1. Provide an accurate assessment of the applicant's suitability for medical school rather than advocate for the applicant.
