

# Items Not Requiring Prior Approval

Test-takers are permitted to bring certain items into the testing room without prior approval. These items are allowed in the testing room after being visually inspected by the test center staff.

## Medication

- Auto-injectors such as EpiPen.
- Cough drops (must be unwrapped and not in a bottle or container).
- Eye drops.
- Glucose tablets.
- Inhaler.
- Nasal drops/spray.
- Pills (e.g., Tylenol or aspirin; must be unwrapped and not in a bottle or container).

\*Note: Candidates may bring pills that are still in the packaging if the medication states that it MUST remain in the packaging, e.g., nitro glycerin pills that cannot be exposed to air. Packaging may be subject to visual inspection.

## Physical Supports

- Bandages.
- Braces/casts, including slings for broken/sprained arms and other injury-related items that cannot be removed.
- Eye patches.
- Eyeglasses (without the case), including tinted lenses, and Fresnel prisms; eyeglasses must be removed for visual inspection.
- Handheld (non-electronic) magnifying glass (without the case).
- Hearing aids.
- Pillow/cushion.
- Medical foot stool. Candidates may bring a medical foot stool to support an injured leg or foot. The stool must be non-skid, have a metal base, and be no larger than 14 inches by 14 inches by 12 inches.

## Medical Devices

Medical devices must be attached to a person's body, must be inaudible, and must not include a remote-control device or receiver. Examples include:

- Insulin pump.
- Spinal cord stimulator.
- Medical/surgical face mask.
- Oxygen tank.

## Mobility Devices

- Canes/crutches/walkers.
- Motorized scooters/chairs.

- Wheelchairs: Our standard exam tables have a clearance of 30 inches. If your wheelchair requires a height-adjustable table, please apply for accommodations so we may better serve you.

## Other Items Not Requiring Approval

- Facial tissues (must be provided by the testing center).
- Earplugs (must be provided by the testing center).\*
- Noise reducing headphones (must be provided by the testing center).\*
- Medical alert bracelets.
